DUCKS NEWS AND NOTES

The Faithful Flock: Since their inaugural season of 2000, the Long Island Ducks have welcomed an Atlantic League record 7,906,165 fans through the gates of Bethpage Ballpark. Long Island reached the 7.5 million fan mark faster than any other team in league history despite having begun play in the ALPB's third year of existence (2000). The Ducks have also hosted a league-record 686 sellout crowds all-time and have led the Atlantic League in attendance 14 times. The crowd of 7,312 on July 4th was the seventh-largest attendance in franchise history.

<u>Ducks vs. Skeeters:</u> Tonight marks the 12th meeting of the season and 149th all-time meeting between the Ducks and Skeeters. The Ducks hold a 76-72 edge in the all-time series, but the Skeeters have a 43-30 advantage at Constellation Field. Long Island also has a 7-4 lead in the 2019 season series, with the teams splitting four games in Sugar Land. Last year, the Ducks won the season series with the Skeeters 10-8, going 5-4 both at home and on the road.

<u>Playoff Bound:</u> The Ducks officially clinched the First Half Liberty Division title on July 6th thanks to Somerset's loss at High Point. Long Island has now won six first half championships in team history, with this being their first since 2016 when they defeated Sugar Land at Bethpage Ballpark. The Ducks have earned their 14th berth in the Atlantic League playoffs, all coming in the past 16 seasons.

T.J. is A-OK: T.J. Rivera earned another multi-hit games with a pair of singles on Friday. The former New York Mets infielder has collected multiple hits in both games he's played with the Flock thus far. He has totaled five hits in his first eight at-bats with Long Island, picking up two doubles, an RBI and a run as well. Rivera had just one multi-hit game in his six games played during the 2018 season.

Romero Rakes: Deibinson Romero collected a double in Friday's game, good for his 10th two-bagger of the year. The infielder has now reached base safely in 11 of his past 12 games after beginning his Ducks career 0-for-7, earning at least one hit in 10 of them. He is 13-for-44 (.295 AVG) in those 12 games with five doubles, a homer, seven RBIs and five runs. Romero has reached base safely in 19 of his past 21 games overall going back to June 11th.

Masterful Mariel: Mariel Checo pitched two scoreless innings on Friday, striking out a pair of batters. The right-hander has now made three consecutive scoreless appearances, spanning five and one-third innings. Going back to June 26th, he has allowed just three runs in a span of 10 innings, good for a 2.70 ERA. Dating back to June 8th, he has surrendered just five runs in 21 innings, which equates to a 2.14 ERA. Checo has pitched more than one inning in 10 of his 15 games.

<u>Ducks Debut:</u> Seth Simmons made his Ducks debut on the mound Friday as the starter. He was acquired by Long Island from the High Point Rockers to complete the trade from February 27, 2019, for left-handed pitcher Ashur Tolliver. Simmons is in his first Atlantic League season and went 5-4 with a 4.21 ERA in 13 starts with High Point before joining the Flock. He has previously pitched in the Arizona Diamondbacks and San Diego Padres organizations as well.

YESTERDAY'S GAME RECAP

The Long Island Ducks were defeated by the Sugar Land Skeeters 5-0 on Friday night in the opener of a six-game series at Constellation Field.

Sugar Land took a 3-0 lead in the first inning off Ducks starter Seth Simmons on Zach Borenstein's two-run home run to right field and Ryan Jackson's sacrifice fly to center. A two-out throwing error in the fifth allowed Anthony Giansanti to score from second base, increasing the advantage to four.

Long Island put two on base with two outs in the seventh and collected a hit along with two walks in the eighth, but they were unable to pull even. Jason Martinson's solo homer to left in the eighth rounded out the scoring.

Skeeters starter Joe Lienhard (1-0) earned the win, tossing five scoreless innings, allowing four hits while striking out three. Simmons (5-5) took the loss, surrendering four runs (three earned) on four hits and four walks over five innings with five strikeouts.

T.J. Rivera led the Flock offensively with a pair of hits.

LAST TIME OUT: Darin Downs earned his first win of the 2019 season, as the Ducks defeated the Sugar Land Skeeters 3-1 on July 4th. The southpaw tossed five innings of one-run ball, allowing five hits and four walks while striking out seven batters. He threw 92 pitches in the outing, 52 of which were strikes (57 percent). Downs allowed a leadoff solo homer to Ryan Jackson in the first but no runs after that. He also stranded eight men on base during his five innings.

BACK IN BLACK: Darin Downs returns to Long Island after having his contract purchased by Acereros de Monclova in the Mexican League on June 4th. It marked the second time his contract was purchased from the Ducks. In 2016, the Uni-President Lions purchased Downs' contract on July 27th. Since returning from Mexico, Downs has gone 1-1 with a 3.06 ERA, giving up seven runs (six earned) on 22 hits and seven walks over 17.2 innings with 24 strikeouts.

MAJOR EXPERIENCE: Darin Downs spent three seasons in the Major Leagues, including two with the Detroit Tigers (2012-13) and one with the Houston Astros (2014). He combined to make 92 relief appearances, posting a 4-4 record with a 4.76 ERA and 84 strikeouts over 90.2 innings of work. The Florida resident tossed a scoreless inning in his MLB debut on July 3, 2012, against the Minnesota Twins and made four consecutive scoreless appearances to begin his Major League career (5.1 innings).

PITCHER TIDBITS

- Selected by the Chicago Cubs in the fifth round of the 2003 amateur draft out of Santaluces Community High School.
- Selected as Florida State League Mid-Season and Post-Season All-Star in 2009 after going 12-4 with a 2.00 ERA in 20 games (19 starts) as a member of the Charlotte Stone Crabs (A+, Rays).
- Named the MiLB.com Class A Advanced Starting Pitcher of the Year that
- Downs suffered a concussion after taking a line drive to the head in 2009 and experience post-concussion syndrome following the incident.
- Previously spent parts of 2015 and 2016 with Long Island, combining to go 12-10 with a 3.70 ERA and 163 strikeouts over 172.2 innings. He also pitched eight scoreless innings over two playoff games (one start) in 2015.
- Has been part of back-to-back championship teams, winning the Chinese Professional Baseball League in 2017 with the Lamigo Monkeys and the Mexican League with Sultanes de Monterrey in 2018.
